## Olivier Bastin (Belgium)

Master Architect of Brussels

Olivier Bastin is the man behind major projects such as the National Theatre in Brussels. He was appointed Master Architect of Brussels for a period of 5 years in 2009. His role is to define an identity and architectural quality for Brussels.



## Carlos Arroyo (Spain)

Contemporary architect, urbanist and critic from Madrid

His work claims to set the frame for a new architectural culture, language and aesthetics, through the ethics, technology and parameters of sustainability. He has won the Holcim Silver Award for Sustainable Construction in Europe in 2011 for a project called Oostcampus in Oostkamp. He has also designed the Music Academy MWD in Dilbeek.



## **Edward Schwarz (Switzerland)**

General Manager, Holcim Foundation for Sustainable Construction

Edward Schwarz was appointed as the inaugural General Manager of the Holcim Foundation in 2003. He is responsible for all activities of the Foundation, including the Awards competitions. He has produced more than 20 international prize hand-over ceremonies and edited some 30 publications on sustainable construction.
